

WE THE PEOPLE of the United States charged with the duty to maintain and defend the integrity of the United States Constitution herewith give Notice to the United Nations, its General Assembly, and to the General Secretariat, to wit:

WE THE PEOPLE of the
United States charged with the duty
to maintain and defend the integrity

WHEREAS the Senators and
Representatives...both of the United
States and of the several States,
shall be bound by Oath or
Affirmation, to support this
Constitution.... pursuant to Art. VI, §
1, cl. 3, and by Oath and Affirmation,
the President did swear that he will
faithfully execute the Office of

President of the United States, and
will to the best of his ability,
preserve, protect, and defend the
Constitution of the United States,
pursuant to Art. II, § 1, cl. 8; and

WHEREAS the Kyoto Protocol
and Copenhagen Treaty create a tax
upon the citizens of the United
States outside the provisions of
Article 1, § 8, cl. 1, § 9, cl. 4, 5 and
6, and Amendment XVI of the United
States Constitution, and therefore,
are unconstitutional; and

WHEREAS membership of the
United States in the United Nations,
creates an unconstitutional demand
that citizens of the United States be
bound by and subject to trial by the
United Nations International and
Criminal Court Systems, pursuant to

Art. I, § 3, cl. 6 and 7, Art. III, §§ 1
and 2, cl. 1, 2, and 3, § 3, cl. 1 and
2, and Amendments V, VI, VII, VIII,
XI; and

WHEREAS the demand by the
United Nations that the United
States execute the Law of the Sea
Treaty, which gives effective
ownership of all the seas and
oceans of the world to the United
Nations, and which usurps the
Constitutional duty and ability of the
United States Armed Forces to
defend itself and the territory of the
United States against enemy
aggression from on, below, and
above the seas and oceans of the
world, without the permission of the
United Nations, is unconstitutional
pursuant to Art. I, § 8, cl. 10, 13, 14,

15, 16, and Art. IV, § 4; and

Since the Law of the Sea Treaty provides that capitalistic exploration of the sea and ocean beds, considered to be a natural resource owned by no country of the world, further prohibits the citizens of the United States to explore, excavate, and mine without the consent of and payment of consideration to the United Nations, and further authorizes the United Nations to mandate consideration be given by the citizens of the United States to countries selected by the United Nations, the rights to primary exploration sites discovered by the citizens of the United States, along with the equipment for exploration, technological instruction, and

financial means to excavate and mine these natural resources for the selected country's private profit, is unconstitutional and contrary to the capitalistic economic system of the United States pursuant to Art. I, § 8, cl. 8 and Art. IV, § 3, cl. 2; and

WHEREAS the United Nations seeks to control the citizens' of the United States right to bear arms, which right implies the ability to purchase ammunition for such arms, and the United Nations call for the taxation on personal weapons and ammunitions in order to limit and restrict the ability of citizens to carry out their right to bear arms, and/or render those weapons useless without ammunition, and the United Nations policy to mandate a

database be kept and maintained of the names, addresses, type and number of guns and amount of ammunition held by the citizens of the United States, is unconstitutional pursuant to Art. I, § 9, cl. 3, 4, 5 and 6, and Amendments II and IV; and

WHEREAS the United Nations' policy against individual private property ownership is counter to the principles and values of the citizens of the United States and their pursuit of happiness and capitalistic economic development, pursuant to the lack of such prohibitions of private property ownership enumerated in the United States Constitution; and

WHEREAS the United Nations seeks to gather all the nations of the

world under the single control of the United Nations, rendering the United States Constitution null and void, is unconstitutional pursuant to Art. I, § 4, cl. 1, 2, and § 5, cl. 1, 2 3, and 4, § 6, cl. 1 and 2, § 7, cl. 1, 2, 3, § 8, cl. 1, 17, 18, § 9, cl. 2, Art. IV, § 3, cl. 1, § 4, Amendment XIII, §§ 1 and 2, and Amendment XIV, §§ 1, 2 and 3, and THEREFORE,

WE THE PEOPLE of the United States herewith give notice that the United States withdraws its membership in, with, and under the United Nations, effective upon presentment to a servicer for delivery of this Notice; and

WE THE PEOPLE of the United States herewith withdraw the United States as a party to any and

all treaties, including the Law of the Sea Treaty, Kyoto Protocol, Copenhagen Treaty, any and all agreements, subgroups, military, all international and/or world courts, or agencies of the United Nations; and

WE THE PEOPLE of the United States herewith give notice that the United Nations, its General Assembly and Secretariat, other member nation representatives and staff are to vacate the territory of the United States forthwith; and

WE THE PEOPLE of the United States herewith demand that all military and paramilitary troops under the auspices and control of the United Nations withdraw from the territory of the United States forthwith, pursuant to Amendment III.

WE THE PEOPLE of the
United States herewith sign this
Notice with the authority vested in us
as the posterity described in the
Preamble of the United States
Constitution, to wit:

WE THE PEOPLE of the United
States, in Order to form a
more perfect Union, establish
Justice, insure domestic
Tranquility, provide for the
common defence, promote the
general Welfare, and secure the
Blessings of Liberty to ourselves
and our Posterity, do ordain and
establish this Constitution for
the United States of America.
